The William S. Hart Union High School District is hosting a District-wide/City wide CADRE parent/student drug awareness seminar on May 4, 2010, from 7:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m., in the new West Ranch High School Theater. We are encouraging all schools in Santa Clarita to participate.

Sergeant Tom Lorenz of the Glendale Police Department will be the keynote speaker. He will offer information regarding drug and alcohol use and abuse by school age children in the local community. On this particular evening he will talk about:

Trends in Drug Abuse: Getting High on Over-the-Counter Drugs and the use of Marijuana

This seminar will expose attendees to the latest phenomenon in substance abuse and addiction. The abuse of over-the-counter (OTC) drugs is a growing problem in our community. OTC drugs are cheap and widely available methods for getting high and are abused by adolescents and young adults. Attendees will learn about OTC drug pharmacology and will become familiar with methods on how the drug is used. We will also have a segment on marijuana, the Myths of delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol (Δ 9-THC).

There will also be a presentation on how the CADRE program works and an opportunity to enroll students in the district's voluntary random drug testing program. Handout materials will be provided by the MEDTOX DAR program, which conducts the district's drug testing.

The evening program is for students, parents, family, neighbors and friends. It is an educational program to offer an insight into what our students have been exposed to in the way of illegal drugs.
